AFFIDAVIT ON COMPLAINT (O.R.C. 2935.09)

STATE OF OHIO, MERCER COUNTY, SS:

I, Patrolman Jeremy Kerr, do hereby state that I am employed at the Celina Police Department. The following did occur:

On or about May 31, 2025 at approximately 4:30 PM, Dispatch advised of an active theft at Victim #1's place of business, 1950 Havemann Road in Celin, Mercer County, Ohio. An employee from Victim #1's Asset Protection department advised that a male wearing a blue shirt had pushed a cart full of merchandise past all points of sale and was loading the merchandise into a van at the north end of Row 7 in Victim #1's parking lot.

Shortly after arriving on scene, we located the van and the male in a blue shirt, who was identified as Antonio Chirionos. Chirionos did not have any form of identification. Another male was located at the vehicle, and he was identified as Victor Osorio. Both males were questioned about the merchandise in the vehicle. They both denied stealing anything and claimed to have paid in cash at a self-checkout. Neither male had a receipt, and both claimed to have thrown their receipts away.

Upon review of store surveillance footage, both males were observed walking together through Victim #1's business, selecting items, and putting those items in their respective shopping carts. They were then observed separating from each other. A few minutes apart from each other, they were each observed walking out of the store with their respective shopping carts without having paid for the merchandise.

Sergeant Colin Fuelling received permission from Victim #1's representative to remove the merchandise from the vehicle. There were several speakers, clothing, pre-paid cell phones, food items, and other miscellaneous merchandise removed from the vehicle.

Chirionos and Osorio were placed under arrest for theft and transported to the Mercer County Jail. The value of the merchandise stolen was \$2,103.54.
